Two Years Ago
Professor Paul H. Grumman, director of the School of Fine Arts, conducted a course in Continental Drama for the Omaha Forum, the organization of Omaha public school teachers. The course was given under the Extension Division of the University of Nebraska.
Grace Dobbish and Rose Faytenger related their experiences as workers in the Chicago industrial world. These young women, members of the industrial experiment group conducted under the auspices of the Y. W. C. A. worked in a factory for six weeks, studying, meanwhile, the social conditions in that sphere.
Ex-Congressman R. H. Thorpe of Lincoln presented the Republican arguments of the campaign to the members of the World Forum at its meetings at the Grand Hotel.

"College Cars"
Students have been forbidden the use of cars at the University of Illinois. As a consequence all of the horses and buggies available have been put into use as a means of transportation.
Automobiles have been banned off the campus at the University of Oklahoma at Norman.
The University of Illinois, Purdue and Indiana State are among the larger Universities that have forbidden automobiles on the campus.
Automobiles will be banned off the campus at the University of Kansas if the efforts of Chancellor Lindley go through.
The University of Michigan authorities were unable to pass an edict on automobiles on the University campus.
University of Oregon authorities have appealed to parents to prohibit their sons and daughters from bringing cars to school on the grounds that automobiles are the cause of low scholarship and increase danger of moral delinquency.

Over 10,000 Schools Publish Newspapers
There are over 10,000 schools in the United States publishing newspapers and journals.
Scholastic journalism is rapidly assuming a position of vital importance in American national life, according to Prof. Edward Johnson of Wisconsin University.
Professor Johnson gave as the chief aims of school papers the promotion of scholarship, the development of able leadership, and the forwarding of community spirit in the school.

CORN HAS GREATEST ANIMAL FOOD VALUE

Prof. Mussehl Declares That More Nutrient Contained in It Than Other Grains

That corn is the most important of all the cereals which can be used for animal production was the declaration of Prof. F. E. Mussehl of the department of poultry husbandry of the University of Nebraska in an address before the Nebraska chapter of Sigma Xi Wednesday evening on "Vitamin and Mineral Requirements of Chicks."
No other cereals, he pointed out, yields for a given unit of land and labor so many units of nutrients. The competition between humans and food producing animals for the direct use of corn probably is more remote than with any other common foodstuff, Prof. Mussehl said, pointing out that more than 85 per cent of the corn produced in the United States is now used for animal feeding.
Corn, as a food for poultry, is not a complete nutrient, he explained. Yellow corn is deficient in minerals, proteins, and vitamins, the lack of which may be offset by the addition of 3 per cent of yeast to the ration.

Expect Large Homecoming Crowd
Missouri University anticipates the greatest homecoming crowd in the history of the university. The feature of the program will be the game with Kansas University, and the formal dedication of the new Memorial Stadium and Memorial Tower.
Princeton has the smallest freshman class this year of the "Big Three" universities. The total number of freshmen at Princeton is 617, at Harvard, is 932 and at Yale 836.
