> No other cereals, he pointed out, yields for a given unit of land and labor so many units of nutrients. The competition between humans and food producing animals for the direct use of corn probably is more remote than with any other common foodstuff, Prof. Mussehl said, pointing out that more than 85 per cent of the corn produced in the United States is now used for animal feed-

Corn, as a food for poultry, is not a complete nutrient, he explained. Yellow corn is deficient in minerals, been put into use as a means of proteins, and vitamins, the lack of which may be offset by the addition of 3 per cent of yeast to the ration.
