Although the Cyclones were prepared to give everything they had to regain the lost conference harrier championship, they were given but an outside chance to win from the Kansas Aggie team, champions of the Valley for the past two years, and running a team of five-mile men with three years experience. The fact that Captain Conger, Cyclone runner, came in first, to establish the new Missouri Valley record of 25:52 for the five mile grind, won the championship for Iowa State. Hoak, running his first year for the Cyclones, finished fourth, while Christenson, Thompson and Cervi finished eleventh, twelfth and thirteenth for Iowa
