Incidentals Fee Reduced
The DePauw University incidentals fee for its students has been reduced from \$225 to \$175 a semester according to an enactment of the board of trustees. The erection of a dormitory for men to cost \$250,000 was approved and the building will be constructed upon the present site of Ross Bower, a campus landmark.

The cash value of a college education has been estimated at \$70,000 by a statistician who based his calculations on the earning capacities of a number of university graduates.

The University of Wisconsin will test the new curricula and teaching methods in an experimental college starting in the fall of 1927.

Orchestra Appearing Here in January Was Official Organization

The Tipica Orchestra of Mexico, which is appearing at the City Auditorium the afternoon and evening of January 5, under the auspices of the American Legion, is one of the foremost orchestras of Mexico.

Practically all of the musicians making up the Mexican Tipica Orchestra are graduates of the National Conservatory of Music in Mexico City. Mexican folk songs, brought from various parts of Mexico by the musicians, have been incorporated into selections which have proved of interest to Americans.

The orchestra was organized in 1924 and was chosen by Alvaro Obregon, then president of Mexico, as his official musical organization. Last season the orchestra toured the west. This season they are repeating the tour of the west and are making their first appearance east of the Mississippi River.

VALLEY OFFICIALS MEET THIS WEEK

Coaches and Directors in Conference At Des Moines; Will Talk Rules And Make New Schedules

Coaches and athletic directors of the Missouri Valley will hold their annual meet at Des Moines, Iowa, the last three days of this week. Officers of the conference anticipate the largest gathering of Missouri Valley authorities ever held. The new shift rule of the Big Ten, interpretation of basketball rules and the framing of next year's schedules will occupy the time of coaches and directors of the Missouri Valley conference.

The action of the Missouri Valley officials on the new Big Ten football rule is problematical. Information here is that there is no serious opposition in prospect, but whether the conference will adopt it formally or accept it for schools scheduling games with Big Ten teams and leave its enforcement optional in conference contests is doubtful. Some of the valley schools use the play and others do not. Thursday is to be given over to discussion of basketball rules. Friday and Saturday the officials will dispose of other conference matters, including the schedules for football, track, baseball, swimming, tennis, golf and wrestling.

Manhattan, Kansas, Dec. 2.—Twenty-six purple football letters, the largest number ever given to a Kansas Wildcat grid team, six cross country awards, and twenty-four freshman football numerals will be awarded to the past season's athletes at Kansas State college following the coaches' recommendations.

Of the grid players one man, Dewey Huston, is receiving his fourth letter, having played during 1918, a year which is not considered in Missouri valley rules, six are gaining their third season's emblems, nine their second, and the remainder their
