CYCLONES LOSE MANY CROSS COUNTRY MEN

Graduation and Ineligibility Wreck Hopes of Iowa State's Coach

AMES, Ia., Sept. 11.—(Special)—With graduation, transfer and ineligibility eliminating three of last year's regulars and the most promising winner among last year's yearlings, the hopes of Bob Simpson, head track coach at Iowa State college, for a conference winning Cyclone cross country team have been given a setback.

The 1928 team will be built about the three regulars who are returning this fall: Irving L. Christensen, Eagle Grove; Harry L. Hoak, Des Moines; and Richard Carl Behrens, Davenport. Coach Simpson said. These three men ran in all of last year's races, assisted in winning all of the dual meets for Iowa State college and helped the Cyclone squad to place high in the annual conference competition.

Men Will Be Missed.

The men whom Coach Simpson will miss in fall track activities are: C. H. Thompson, Hampton, who was graduated this summer from the animal husbandry department; Carl E. Gericke, Mount Carmel, Neb., who is transferring to the University of Southern California this fall; Theron S. Smith, Cedar Rapids, who will not be in school this fall; and Rupert L. Lynch, Schaller, last year's numeral man who will be ineligible.

"The prospects for this fall are none too good, with only three men of experience available," stated Coach Simpson. William W. Bailey, Red Lodge, Mont., senior student in veterinary medicine, has promise of making the varsity sextet the Cyclone coach said. Other possibilities that Coach Simpson has in mind to fill the remaining berths are: Harlan R. Putnam, Elvins, Mo., numeral man of last fall; Veri G. Baker, Newton, another numeral man; and Walter W. Thompson, Hampton.

Low Will Be Instructor In Zoology Department

Harry E. Low will be instructor in Zoology this year, after teaching here during the summer. He was formerly instructor at the University of Arkansas. His undergraduate work and master's degree were taken at the University of Iowa.

IN THE VALLEY

The new Big Six conference opens its first year this season and prospects and the outlook for a successful conference look exceptionally bright. Although several new faces appear in the coaching roles football elevens throughout the conference will be stronger than last season. Nebraska's outlook is the best in years and the weight of the 1928 Cornhusker machine is probably one of the heaviest in the conference.

Although the Missouri Valley name is gone for Nebraska and the new Big Six conference now starts out on what looks to be a successful year, the in the Valley column will remain the same. All members of the Big Six are located in the vicinity of the Missouri Valley and the column has been one of the athletic features of the Nebraskan sports department for many years.

Among the new coaches in the conference this year are Alvin N. "Bo" McMillan, the new football chief of the Kansas Aggies. McMillan, came to the Aggies from Centre College where he gained fame on the gridiron, winning a quarterback position on the All-American eleven. The Aggies open their season with Bethany college of the Kansas conference.

The second new football mentor to appear in the Big Six is "Big" Bill Hargiss, former Emporia Teachers football coach who is opening his first year with Kansas university. Hargiss is reputed to be one of the best gridiron tutors in Kansas and is wielding a powerful

ful team into action for the Big Six season.

The name of the Missouri Valley conference will be preserved by the four schools of the old circuit that are not in the Big Six conference. It is made up of Washington, Grinnell, Drake, and Oklahoma Aggies.

Coach Bearg, Nebraska mentor, has two backfield combinations that would make any football coach happy. In the practice session last night, the first backfield was made up of "Reb" Russell at the signal job, Blue Howell and Clair Sloan at halves and Farley at full. In the second combination Bearg had the old Lincoln pair of backs, Witte and McBride, and at quarter Harold Peaker and Frann at full.

Cliff Ashburn, 190-pound end, is one of the outstanding men for the wing position on the 1928 grid eleven. Coach Leo Scherer, wing coach of the Varsity will have to develop new men for these positions on the Nebraska eleven. Among the prominent candidates are Morris Fisher, former Lincoln high footballer, a sophomore. Fisher has been working with Ashburn on the first eleven during the opening sessions of practice.

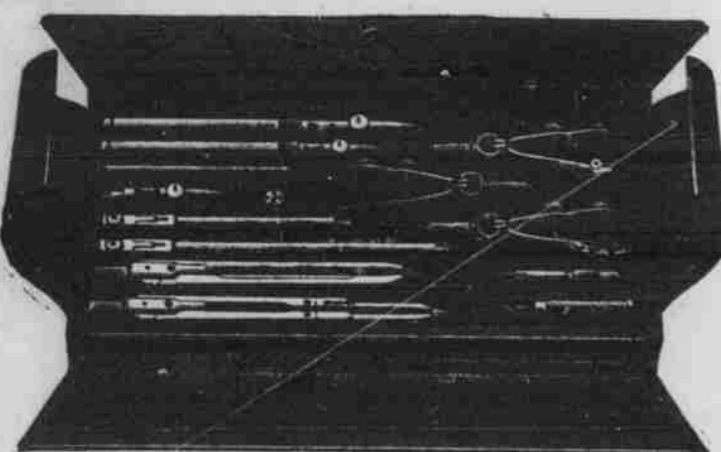

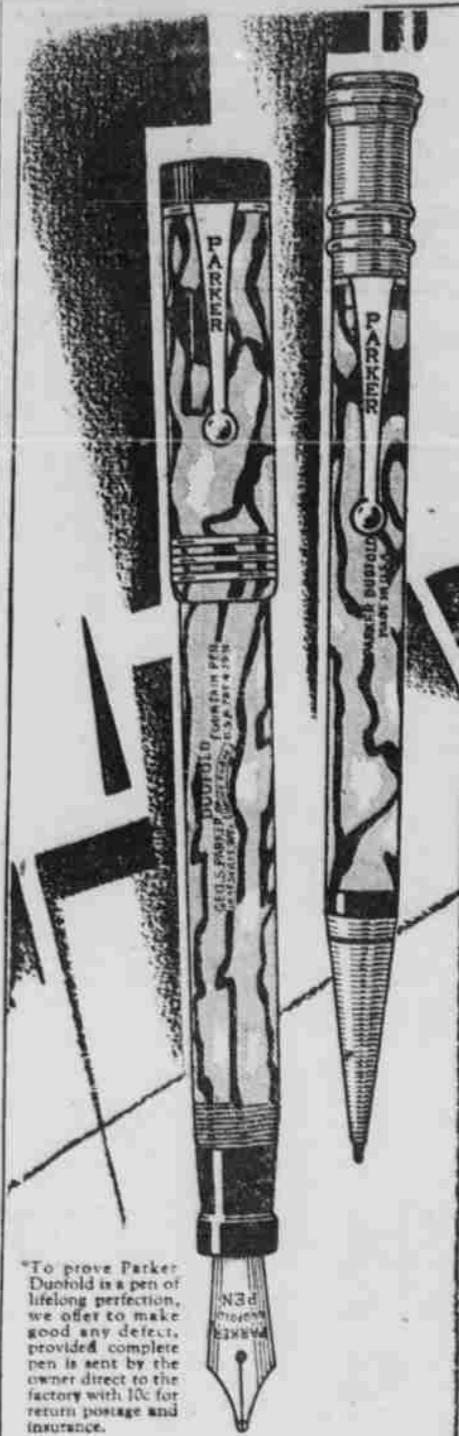
