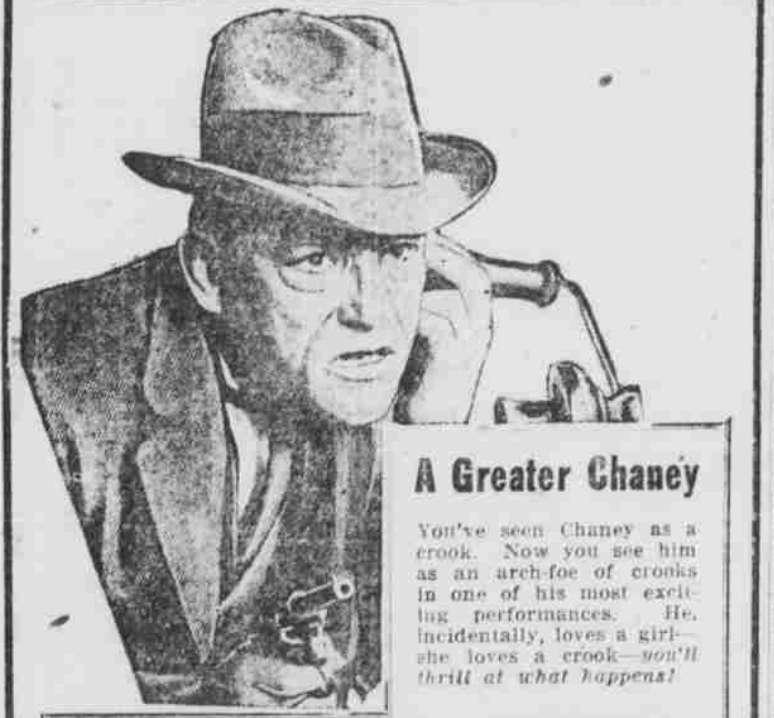

mad. In addition to themselves, they had to arrange for the transportation of all their supplies, as they were going into a country from which they would only be able to obtain fresh meat. So a caravan of seventy-five camels had to be sent on two months before, carrying eighteen tons of equipment.

One of the greatest finds of the expedition, according to Mr. Collins, was that of dinosaur eggs. Dinosaur had been classed by the great naturalists of Europe and America as reptiles. Reptiles, like birds, always reproduce their kind by laying eggs, but no one was sure these enormous monsters of the past had laid eggs, until some fossil specimens were found by a member of the Andrews party.

News has come that the Andrews expedition, on this trip to Mongolia, has found a great quantity of implements and ornaments, revealing the culture of man during the period between the early and late stone ages. They have also found fossils never heard of before.

Ninety Cases of Fossils. "This expedition of the Natural History museum," concluded Mr. Collins in his radio talk, "has safely completed another season's work in Mongolia, and once more has returned through the gate in the Great Wall of China to Peking with no less than ninety cases of fossils. On this occasion Mr. Andrews seems to be having some difficulty in getting by with his fossils."
