Salamander Is New Addition to School Museum

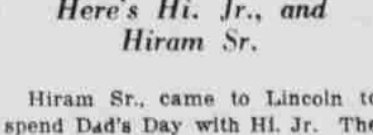

young lady, not being acquainted with the home life or favorite dishes of her suddenly acquired guest, hesitated to harbor it under her roof, as the old saying goes.

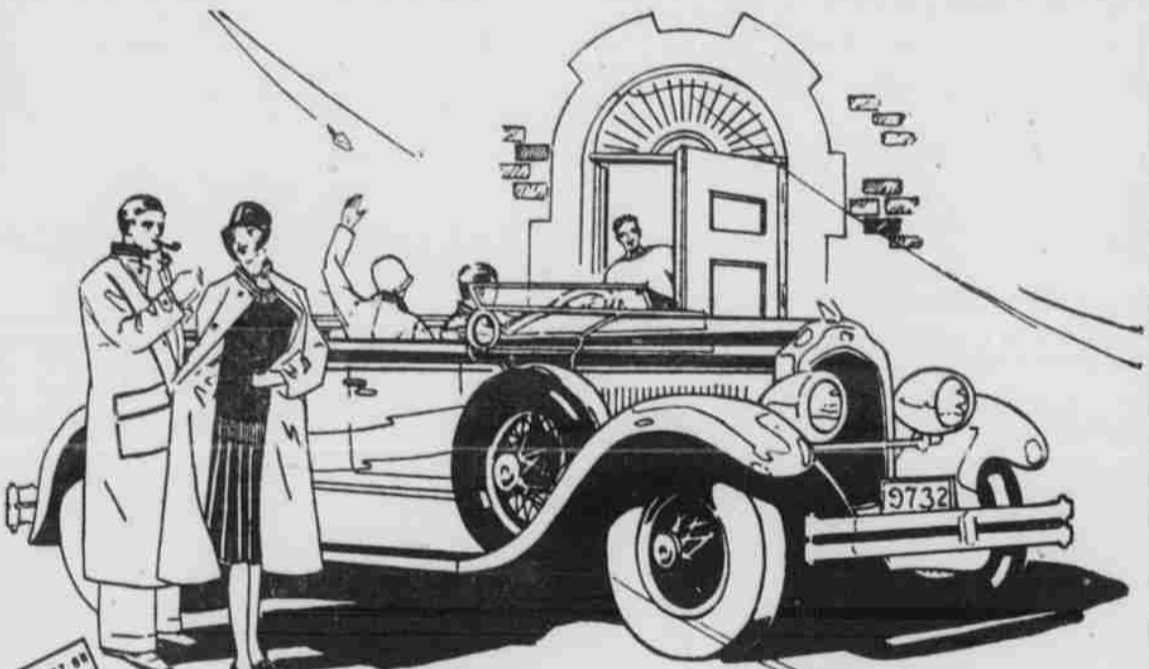

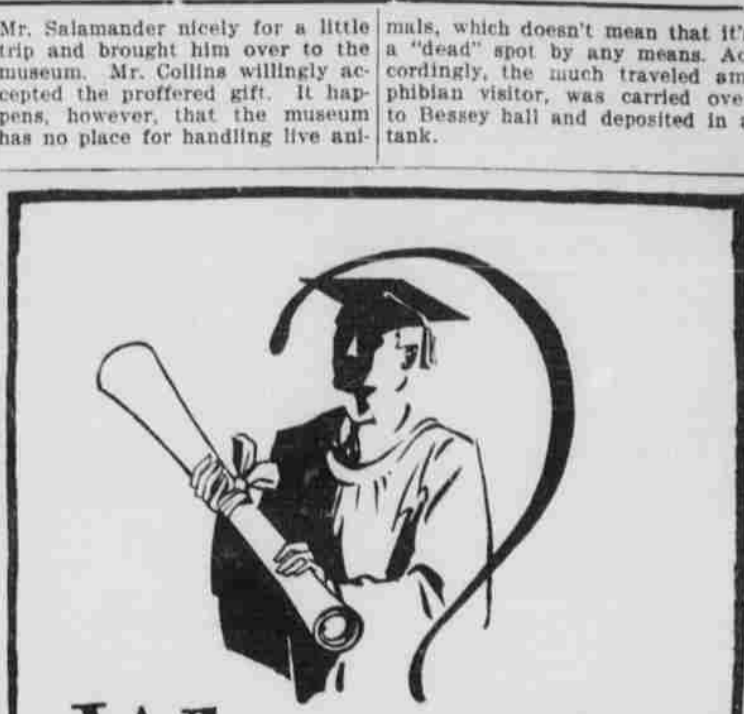
