NEBRASKA SEWS UP TITLE IN BIG SIX

100 points was amassed by the scarlet and cream in its sweep to victory over the conference eleven. The biggest score of the season was registered against the Oklahoma Sooners while the Kansas Aggie Wildcats held Nebraska to the lowest score of the season as the two eleven's battled it out on a snow covered field on Thanksgiving day. Down on the Sooner field, Nebraska met a fighting eleven from the Oklahoma school and downed the southern eleven 44 to 6 but the men of Coach Ad Lindsey gave the Bearmen a great battle.

To Coach Ernest E. Bearg, Nebraska's head football coach, and to Coach "Bunny" Oakes, Nebraska's line coach, go a great deal of the credit for the successful season just passed. Coach Bearg was given a wealth of powerful material for his Husker backfield in Lane Howell, Clair Sloan, Red Russell, George Farley, "Dutch" Witte, Claude Rowley and others. Punting was the big department for the Nebraska coaching staff this season. In Rowley and Sloan, Coach Bearg had two of the outstanding punters in the Big Six.

Greatest Line Says Jones
Coach "Biff" Jones made a statement that Nebraska had the greatest line he ever saw and to this Nebraska followers are not doubting. The Cornhusker forward wall was one of the greatest in the history of Nebraska football. Leading the figures that played in Nebraska's line is Dan McMullen, Nebraska's All-American guard, McMullen is ranked with the greatest in the country and played a superb brand of football throughout the entire season. Closely behind McMullen is Ted James, center, and Elmer Holt, guard. These three stalwarts in Nebraska's line were the outstanding in the Big Six conference and were assisted by Broadstone, Munn, Ashburn, Richards and others.

Missouri and Oklahoma finished in a second place tie in the conference with two defeats and three victories. The Mizzou eleven dropped its first game to Nebraska and then closed the season by losing to Oklahoma. The Sooners lost to Nebraska and then to Iowa State. In both cases, each eleven was undefeated until the meeting with the conference champions.
