Dr. E. Stanley Jones Cherishes Belief That Christianity Welcomes Science

"Christianity is not afraid of science. All we ask is that it be sufficiently scientific. All we say is to go to the limit in seeking the facts. The more scientific life grows, the more masterful Christ becomes in the world."

Such are the contentions of Dr. E. Stanley Jones, world famous evangelist missionary, who will be in Lincoln the week of March 17 to 22. The series of meetings will be interdenominational in character, and are to be held under the auspices of the combined religious and educational institutions of the city and community.

Dr. Jones is the missionary of India who has been discussed so much in recent years. He was educated in Wilmore college in Kentucky, a small Methodist college. He made a profound study of Buddhism, Hinduism and Mohammedanism, and became convinced that the approach to the people of other religions had been wrong.
