South Dakota Professor Finds Rare Fossil at Base of Nebraska Bluffs

Vermilion, S. D. March, 25—The second known fossil of a long extinct animal now named after the Vermilion river where the first specimen was found, has been discovered by W. V. Searight, assistant professor of geology at the University of South Dakota.

Animal Now Extinct

The only other known specimen of the extinct animal is now in the possession of federal paleontologists in Washington. The first specimen of the animal was found in 1854 by F. V. Hayden, geologist with the Northwest exploring expedition commanded by General G. K. Warren.

On March 29, 1904, the outstanding news event was the trip into Minnesota made by the girls' basketball team. Particular mention was made of the fact that the girls missed but one day of school.

Plan For World's Fair At the same time, preparations were being made to ship an exhibit to the world's fair. The material was being placed in three cars, and included specimens of drawing, penmanship, views of the University, public school buildings, geological specimens and pine trees from the sandhills.
