 Coach Dana X. Biele, who assumed control of football this year, succeeding E. E. Bear, praised by Thompson as a leader as fine as can be found in any institution but ably followed here by Biele, was greeted with cheers.
 Speaking as "freshman to freshman," Coach Biele claimed that athletics is as much a part of college education as purely educational activities. George Farley, captain of this year's Scarlet and

Cream eleven, briefly urged support of the team.
 Coach Henry F. "Indian" Schulte declared that the University of Nebraska is "right" and no place for mollycoddles. "Play the game fair, he advised.
 Final ceremony on the program was administration of the famous Cashmaker oath to new students by Dr. G. E. Condra, "father of Nebraska traditions." He cautioned students to guard themselves against weakness and to stay within productive, constructive lines.
 New students were instructed in

Nebraska yells, learned to accompaniment of the college band. Members of Corn Cobs and Tassels, men's and women's organizations, served as ushers.
 After the initiation freshmen were grouped for still and motion pictures which will be seen in theaters the nation over as part of news reel services.
