

Texas Aggies Will Open Husker Grid Schedule

GISH ANNOUNCES SIGNING OF ONE YEAR CONTRACT

Bible's Old School Comes to Lincoln for First Scarlet Game.

OPPONENTS LOOK GOOD

Southern College Defeats Kansas Aggies During 1929 Season.

Nebraska's Cornhuskers will open the 1930 gridiron slate with Texas A. & M. on Memorial stadium field, according to Herbert Gish, director of athletics at Nebraska. The Texas Aggies were scheduled over the week end to meet the Huskers in Lincoln on Oct. 4. Only a one year contract was made between the two schools. The Texas Aggie game will mark the second adventure the Huskers have taken into the Southwest conference, former home of Dana Bible. This season the Southern Methodist Mustangs, winners of the Southwest conference this year, opened the Nebraska football season at Lincoln with the Aggies from the Lone Star state playing the opener in 1930.

Texas Aggies Look Good.

Texas Aggies were on the field during the 1929 season with a strong eleven and prospects for next year look even brighter. For the past eleven years the Aggies have been coached by Dana X. Bible, now head football mentor at the University of Nebraska. In the eleven years D. X. Bible coached the Texas Aggies he turned out five conference championships and his Aggie teams were known through the southwest as one of the strongest in that section of the country.

The only member of the Big Six to play the Texas Aggies this season was Kansas State. Coach McMillan took his Kansas State eleven to Dallas, Tex., on Oct. 12 and took a 19 to 0 beating at the hands of the southern eleven and when the Kansas State eleven and Nebraska met on Nov. 23, the best the Huskers could do was a 10 to 6 win. This would indicate the strength of the southern eleven as compared to the championship eleven in the Big Six. Twelve, one of the few unbeaten football elevens in the country, was able to take the Texas Aggies down the line to a 13 to 10 beating.

Matty Bell, former Texas Christian coach and former teammate of "Bo" McMillan, coached his first year at Texas Aggies this year after Coach Dana X. Bible resigned to come to Nebraska. In speaking of the Aggie game, Herb Gish, director of athletics, said that Bible realized his former students would be plenty tough but it would give him an opportunity to see just what his Scarlet warriors could do under fire. A setup game would give the Nebraska coaching staff very little opportunity to see what the untried men could do in varsity competition while such a breather will in all probability be scheduled for a later date in the season.

Drops Northwestern Offer.

Northwestern university and Texas A. & M. were negotiating for a football game when the Cornhusker authorities stepped in and negotiations with the Big Ten school were immediately dropped in preference to meeting the Cornhuskers in Lincoln. Nebraska made an impressive showing against the Southwest conference this season when they held the championship Mustang eleven to a scoreless tie in addition to the reputation given the Dallas eleven on their arrival in Lincoln.

Gish stated Monday that a large delegation of Texas Aggie rooters would accompany the southern eleven to Lincoln next fall. The fact that the Aggies will be playing against their old master will draw a large crowd of football fans from the southwest. The Cornhusker schedule at present for 1930 has four games on the home slate which include Texas Aggies, Pitt, Missouri and Kansas Aggies. The away from home slate calls for Oklahoma, Kansas, Iowa State. Two open dates still remain on the schedule those being on Oct. 25 and Nov. 23. Gish intimated that the Husker schedule for 1930 would be completed this week.

Washington Seeks December Schedule With Cornhuskers

Herb Gish, director of athletics at Nebraska, received a telegram from athletic officials at the University of Washington in Seattle Sunday asking for a three game inter-sectional schedule in basketball with the Huskers on Dec. 27, 28 and 30. The Husker cagers are scheduled to meet the University of St. Louis in St. Louis on the 28th and Gish turned down the bid for the game with Washington.

From all indications Washington athletic officials are anxious to again resume relationship with Nebraska in athletic events. Gish stated Monday that he would have liked to accept the contract with the Pacific coast school but on account of its lateness and the complete court schedule at Nebraska, he could not. A resumption of athletic relations with Washington is a possibility in the next two years but with the Husker basketball schedule complete for this year, the Scarlet cagers cannot find a date for the Seattle school.

INTERFRATERNITY RELAY TEAMS TRY OUT IN 'Y' POOL

Tryouts for all interfraternity relay teams were scheduled for tonight at 8 p. m. at the Y. M. C. A. pool. The tryouts will be the last of the preliminaries of the annual interfraternity swimming meet, which this year attracted the largest entry list in its history.

Quarter finals in the 40-yard dash will be run off Wednesday night at 8 p. m. Men who placed first and second in the various heats of the preliminaries will compete in the quarter finals.

Semi-finals for all events will be held Tuesday, Dec. 17 with the finals scheduled for Dec. 19.

CORNHUSKER SQUAD ROUNDS INTO SHAPE

Expect Iowa to Play Here; K. U. Will Be Strong Title Contender.

SOONERS AIM AT TITLE

Nebraska's basketballers are beginning to round into shape that is well nigh of the midseason type. Charley Black still has the men running over the fundamentals and working on new plays, but after the session of acquiring knowledge about the game a lively scrimmage is held.

Last night the same five that represented Nebraska last year was teamed together and the result was anything but displeasing. When they worked on their offense, things clicked just like they were supposed to. On defense, the very outfit held the seconds to very few baskets.

Guards Are Strong.

Lewandowski and Witte are two very potent guards, and when the close formation on defense is used, the Nebraska team looks nearly impregnable. Grace, Fisher, and McClay were working the ball through for counters nearly at will. This team is beginning to acquire the polish that will be plenty valuable when the schedule of games starts.

When Herb Gish was in Kansas City at the Big Six meeting, he managed to have the date for the Oklahoma game changed from Jan. 25 to Jan. 20. He was unable to schedule the Oklahoma Aggie team for a game, but there is a possibility that Iowa University will play on the Nebraska floor this year. Arrangements have not been completed, but there will probably be a game arranged.

Kansas Is Powerful.

Reports coming up from Kansas are to the effect that they are going to have the best team they have had since their leadership of the Missouri valley was taken away by Oklahoma. Coach Allen will do all of the coaching this year, and he has one real schedule to prepare for.

Coach Hugh McDermott of Oklahoma, whose teams have not lost a conference game for the past two years, is in again this year with a team that hopes to carry on the all winning habit. Tom Churchill, the grinning Oklahoma captain, has never played in a losing game of basketball since he started playing with the Sooner first team two years ago.

Six Lettermen with K-Aggies.

With six lettermen and a wealth of promising sophomore for the K-Aggie team, the stock of the Kansas Agricultural school is soaring rapidly. Most promising of the sophomore material is Cronkite, who plays down the football team. This youth is just six feet and weighs in at 140 pounds, and weighs about two hundred pounds. Missouri has the makings of one of the best teams in the conference, as all of their regulars are back in school this year. All six of the lettermen from the Tiger school are more than six feet tall, and height means plenty when it comes to basketball. Last year Missouri finished next to Oklahoma in the struggle for basketball honors, and they are serving warning that they expect to be a great deal better this year.

Nebraska will have one well oiled machine ready to play against any other team in the conference, and it looks like a real season for everybody. Basketball in the Big Six looks to be on a higher plane this season than it was last year.

The Big Ten moguls decided they would much rather continue their conference competition without the much confusion and turmoil at Iowa City. The Hawkeye officials spent a busy week and scheduling games for their 1930 athletic cards. While with the Big Six athletic directors, coaches, faculty representatives and business managers convened at Kansas City to legislate for the middle western circuit. Ten members from the Husker athletic department at Lincoln attended the conference and in addition to completing schedules in preparation for the remainder of the season many phases of conference business were brought up before the meeting upon which definite action will be taken on when the directors meet in Lincoln this winter.

As to the Iowa university affair, the decision of the Big Ten directors didn't seem to impair the health of the Hawkeyes' athletic schedules in the least. In fact if it did anything it added popularity and prominence to the Iowa school. No sooner had the news of the Iowa rejection hit the press of the country, than athletic directors at Iowa City were flooded with offers for games on all their schedules. From all indications at present, Iowa will have a better schedule next year outside the Big Ten than they did when they were members. Iowa now is in the same boat with the Irish of Notre Dame. A team without a conference and whether the Hawkeyes were guilty or not of the charge against them, we will bet our last that the Iowa school was not the only member to offend this ruling.

With a number of open dates on the Iowa schedule, and two open dates on the Husker schedule, the time looks ripe for Nebraska officials to negotiate with the Hawkeye officials for a resumption of football relationship. One of the oldest traditional rivals on the football gridiron at Nebraska is none other than the University of days when the gridiron warriors of the middle west wore their beards in collegiate fashion, the University of Nebraska and the University of Iowa game was one of the biggest in the middle west. These two schools started football relationship almost as soon as football of the two states and only up until ten years ago did the two schools discontinue playing. With Iowa so located as the next door neighbor to Nebraska and the industrial status of the two states generally formed in agricultural lines, a resumption of football relationship with Iowa would be a most desirable thing for Nebraska. An overnight jaunt brings one to Iowa City, the home of the Iowa Hawkeyes which would be most favorable to drawing not only a large football crowd to the games either at Lincoln or at Iowa City but would continue the athletic rivalry which has existed for such a long period of time.

With Texas Aggies definitely on the Cornhusker schedule for next year, Nebraska's slate begins to take on complete form for the coming 1930 season. The Texas Aggie game will replace the Southern Methodist game of this year and will be Coach Bible's old school. It may seem funny to D. X. to pit his Cornhuskers against the Texas school which he coached for the past eleven years, turning out some of the greatest elevens in the southwest. The Texas A. & M. game is booked for October and is the opening game of the season.

Big Six officials are not going to let anything creep into their baby conference as did the Big Ten. At their meeting at Kansas City last week they were unanimous in their decision that a Carnegie report would find nothing wrong with their athletic plant and they were going to see to it personally. A fact finding committee which is more or less an honor committee will investigate all rumors of alleged subsidization of athletics in the conference. The fact finding will consist of questionnaires sent out by the conference for each school to investigate their athletic conditions for any taint of subsidization. A report early in the
