The Husker cagers are scheduled to meet the University of St. Louis in St. Louis on the 28th and Gish turned down the bid for the game with Wash-

From all indications Washington athletic officials are anxious to again resume relationship with Nebraska in athletic events. Gish stated Monday that he would have liked to accept the contract with the Pacific coast school but on ac count of its lateness and the complete court schedule at Nebraska, he could not. A resumption of athletic relations with Washington is a possibility in the next two years but with the Husker basketball schedule complete for this year, the Scarlet cagers cannot find a date for the Seattle school.




