

GREEK BASKETBALL PASSES ROUND TWO

Seven Fraternities Emerge Victorious; Games Held Thursday Night.

TURN IN WIDE SCORES

Alpha Gamma Rho, Farm House, Pi Kappa Phi, Delta Chi, Beta Theta Pi, Phi Kappa and Delta Tau Delta were winners in the second program of interfraternity basketball games Thursday night.

Alpha Gamma Rho handed Sigma Alpha Epsilon a 12 to 8 defeat in the first game for both teams. The Sig Alpha club missed more than enough set-ups to win the game. Alpha Gamma Rho was in the lead throughout the game.

Farm House rode high and left Delta Sigma Phi on the short end of a 36 to 15 count. Pi Kappa Phi romped over the Acacia team to win 26 to 14. Delta Chi and Tau Kappa Epsilon had the closest contest of the program with the former winning 9 to 8.

Beta Theta Pi had little difficulty of disposing of Phi Delta Theta, winning 14 to 4, in a walkway tilt. Phi Kappa won on a forfeit when Kappa Sigma's team failed to arrive on the scene of battle intact. Delta Tau Delta won its first game by downing Theta Xi 10 to 8. The Delta club made all its scores in the first half while blanking the operation, only to have the program reversed in the last half.
