His greatest achievement in the golfing world to date was the defeat he registered against Bobby Jones, peer of American golfers, in the national amateur tournament held at Pebble Beach, Cal., last year. Goodman has been seeded number six in the first ten amateurs of the country. Although Harrison R. "Jimmy" Johnson is the defending champion, he has been seeded No. 2, following Jones. Then come in order George Voight, George Von Elm, Dr. O. F. Willing, Johnny Goodman, Francis Outmet, Cyril Tolley, Don Moe and Jess Sweetser.

### Voight Beats Jones.

As a final display of scoring fireworks preliminary to actual play, Bobby Jones and one of his foremost rivals, George Voight, gave a Sabbath gallery of nearly 5,000 persons a dazzling exhibition of par cracking play Sunday afternoon. Voight turned in a 68 when he holed out a twenty-five foot putt on the eighteenth green for a birdie three, the score being two under par for the hazardous championship layout. Jones narrowly missed a putt of the same length and finished with a 69.

Jones is, of course, the top heavy favorite to win this affair and has set a winning record that may stand for generations, if not for all time. The "seeded" players who are expected to come through the first round include Harrison Johnson, George Voight, George Von Elm, Dr. O. F. Willing, Donald Moe, Cyril Tolley and Johnny Goodman.

### Says Little.

When asked what his chances would be if he were to meet Jones again, Goodman was reluctant to make any statement as to what the outcome would be but said he would like to meet the Atlantan. Sports writers covering the tournament have been giving a great deal of space to the diminutive Omahan and give him a chance to win the tournament, although Jones is given the most consideration.

Johnny has attracted a number of followers, both because of his youth and his playing. He is not yet 21 and is the youngest amateur given any chance in the battle for the national amateur crown.
