It was while Bell was mentor of the Horned Frogs and Bible of the Aggles that the coaching feud began, and though Bible in that time produced two championship teams, his gridsters were able to

score only one victory over the and the entire squad will be avail-

The lone Aggie victory came in 1924, the year of the first meeting of the two coaches, when T. C. of tie games with the Frogu.

The Frogs won two games, in 1925, 3-0, and in 1928, 6-0, while the two tied contests were in 1926, 13-13, and 1927, 0-0. The conference championships were won by A. and M. in 1925 and 1927.
