

Treatment With Flax Seed Increases Yield

AMES, Ia.—Treatment of flax seed increases yields, tests con-ducted by the experiment station at Iowa State college in 1930 for the first time indicate.

In thirty-eight tests started last spring seed treatment with Cere-san increased the stand about 65 percent and the yield 26 percent, according to a report just published by the farm crops section.
