honor to be able to go into politics. He contrasted this with the American viewpoint on politics which is that it is a disgrace to besmirch oneself by having anything to do with the "dirty" game.

Senning declared, however, that we have passed the fork in the roads here in America and that we are taking much more interest in social and political problems. "The era of individualism is past and we are entering an era of group interests. And it is the youth of the nation who must turn towards the agency through which we can work out our national salvation, namely, the government," he concluded.
