

NEBRASKA'S HUSKERS CLOSE AGAINST S.M.U.

Scarlet Victory at Dallas
Would Complete Best
Season in Decade.

Big Six conference play completed with a 21 to 6 victory over Missouri Thanksgiving day, the Cornhuskers resumed workouts Monday afternoon for the final game of the season Saturday against Southern Methodist university at Dallas.

Coach Dana X. Bible personally scouted the S. M. U.-Texas Christian game at Dallas last Saturday, and came back with the information that Coach Ray Morrison's Methodist team is much stronger than its season record indicates. Although T. C. U. won 8-0, Southern Methodist outdressed its opponents two to one and counted more scoring opportunities to its credit.

Victory for the Huskers Saturday will bring to a close the most successful season in a decade. The Nebraska record has been impressive this fall, Minnesota claiming the only victory against Coach Bible's eleven thus far. The Gophers managed to win out by a 7-6 margin, scoring on "fluke" lateral pass play which went uncontested by the Nebraska players. Brightest start in the Bible grid firmament, however, was the 0-0 tie with Pittsburgh on Nov. 12, a game wherein it was necessary for Pitt to stop Nebraska instead of just how long the Scarlet defense wall could hold back the brilliant running and passing attack of the Panthers.

Against Missouri on Turkey day, the conference champions, led by Chris Mathis, started out as if they were going to make short work of the Tigers, scoring on Mathis' dazzling fifty-nine yard return of a punt, and advancing within the 5-yard line on two other occasions, all within the first

quarter. A letdown in the second and third periods allowed Missouri to take the play away from the Husker team, and Schiele caught a pass from Johanningsmeier late in the second quarter for the Carideo outfit's lone tally.

With the start of the fourth period, Mathis shot outside the Tiger left tackle time after time for long gains, Staab ending the march with a romp around left end for the score. A few minutes later, Boswell intercepted a Missouri pass and sped thirty yards for another counter.

The Missourians will also play Saturday, meeting the St. Louis Billikens in the final tilt of the season.
