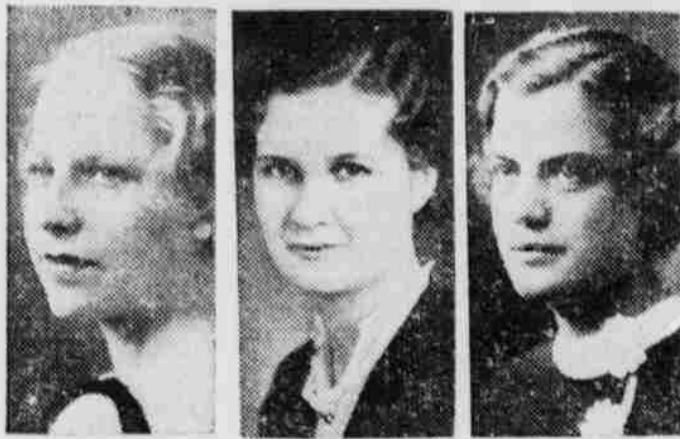
#### Music Notes

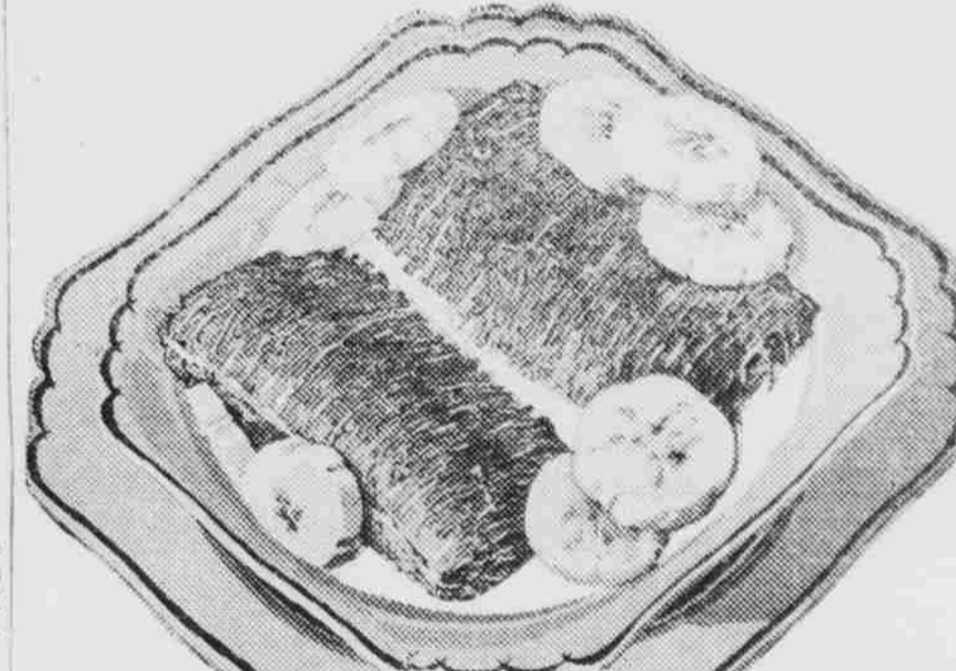
