All the archery matches are to be shot on the outdoor range on the mall south of Andrews Hall. The games scheduled for Wednesday

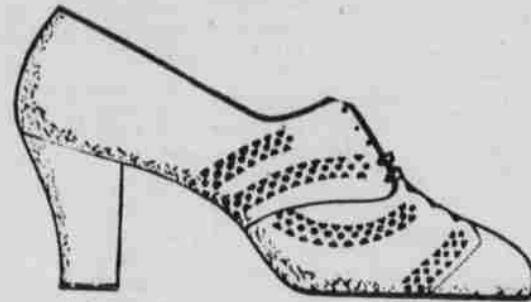
are Alpha Chi Omega vs. Delta Gamma and Theta Phi Alpha vs. Phi Mu.
