HONORARY PLEDGES EIGHT MEN TUESDAY

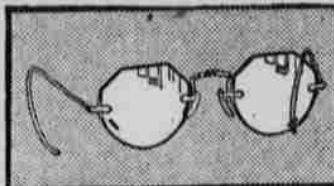
Phalanx to Hold Initiation At Regular Meeting in Two Weeks.

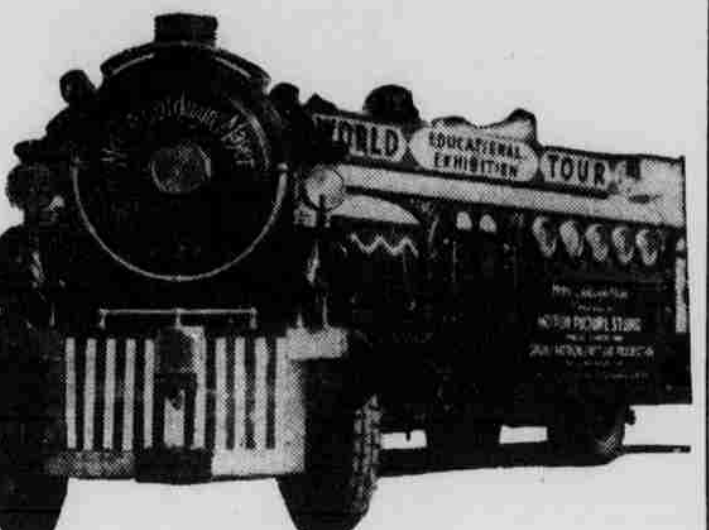
