Lightened drills was the order of Head Coach George Veenker as he gave his team an opportunity to recuperate from its Oklahoma trip and contest under the hot southern sun. Almost every man on the team suffered from loss of weight on the trip, tho the entire squad came thru the Sooner clash without injury.
