REGULAR MEN LACKING Athey May Replace Cosgrove For Oklahoma Contest Saturday.

Not many of the regular Huskers reported to Coach "Pa" Schulte for assignments, and those who came out, basked in the sun and ran a few trial laps. Verl Athey may replace Sherman Cosgrove, No. 1 pole vaulter, for the Oklahoma venture. Standley Haight and Bill Gish ran several flights of low hurdles before the approving nod of Coach Schulte.

Potential Champion.

If his mark of 50 feet 5 inches in the initial Big Six outdoor competition is indicative of "Sam's" prowess as a shotputter, Coach "Pa" Schulte has a potential champion on his great track and field team. At the present time, Francis is the ranking shotputter in collegiate circles. The winner at the recent Penn relays, which drew the cream of the eastern athletic crop, heaved the weight only 48 feet 11 1/2 inches.

"Jake" Performs Well.

Harold "Jake" Jacobsen turned in a good performance against the Jayhawkers, winning the century dash in 10.1 seconds and the 220 in 2.2 seconds. "Jake" had some difficulty during the relay season in breaking away from the starting blocks, but he had no trouble against the Jay sprinters.
