Seventy-two Pianists Will Be Heard in Grand Ensemble

Climaxing the piano tourna-ment, sponsored by the Ne-braska Music Teachers association as a part of their 13th annual convention, 200 pianists, assisted by over 300 choral members, will take part in the carnival Saturday evening. Included in the groups of pi-anists that will be heard are the following: Fifty children, fifty junior high school pupils; thirty-six senior high school students; twenty boys and young men; thirty adultprofessionals; and thirty-six accompanists. Each group will play the compositions as outlined on the program. Numbers of marked rhythm will be presented. Pianists from the following cities will be heard in ensemble: Columbus, Crete, Beatrice, Lincoln, Omaha, Wa-hoo, Nebraska City, Plattsmouth, Fairbury, Pawnee City, Talmage, Lorton, Alvo, Nehawka, Albion, Sargent, Shubert, Stella, Seward, Roca, Hallam, Sprague, Waverly and Alexandria. Seventy-two pianos will be played at once by the above groups.

Directing the piano and choral groups Saturday night when the Nebraska Music Teachers hold their piano carnival will be Leo Kucinski. The carnival, which will be held in the coliseum beginning at 8 p. m., is the first statewide affair to be presented jointly with a state-wide Music Tournament.

Coliseum to Be Scene of Unusual Muscal Event

Inquiries have been received from every county in the state concerning the piano carnival Saturday evening, and approximately 5,000 people are expected to attend. The plan of seating resembles that of the ancient Roman arenas, the audience to be seated in the balcony and in bleachers looking to the center of the coliseum floor, where thirty-six pianos and the choral group will be stationed. It is believed by music teachers that such massed piano productions will help immensely in bringing the piano back as an instrument of wide popularity among students. At one point in the program 72 young pi-anists, two to each instrument, will be playing at once. with 144 hands moving over the keys in unison thru the measures of Mozart's Minuet from the Symphony in E flat. The selection, "Greetings to Spring," is expected to be one of the most varied numbers on the program.
