ALL FRATERNITIES NOW IN SOUND CONDITION, REPORT OF CONTROL BOARD SHOWS

This was to eliminate those who posed as rushees but who had no intention of joining and enjoyed entertainment and free meals at the expense of the fraternities. In 1934 there were a total of 1200 rush cards filed, while only 367 new pledges were secured. In 1935 when the one dollar fee was required, only 463 cards were filed and 348 rushees were secured.
The Alumni Interfraternity Board of Control was organized two years ago, when several fraternities were low financially. They sought aid from Dean Thompson, who called a meeting of alumni representatives of each fraternity. After many months of study and discussion the Board of Regents was requested to create the Board of Control, further giving it broad powers to cope with the situation.

NEBRASKA GRADUATE DISCOVERS NEW DRUG
Dr. Randolph Major Receives Credit for Preparing Rare Compound.
Credit for the synthetic preparation of a new rare drug related

to muscarine goes to a University graduate, Dr. Randolph T. Major, formerly of Lincoln, and to Howard T. Bonnett at Pittsburgh. The drug is used in the treatment of high blood pressure.
Dr. Major received two degrees from the university, graduating from the college of medicine in 1922. He took his Ph.D. in chemistry from Princeton, which was followed by a year's study in Paris and Berlin. He returned to Princeton as research associate on the chemistry staff. Later he accepted a position as director of the research laboratories of the

Merck Chemical company at Rahway, N. J.
The chemist is the son of Mrs. Mary Campbell Major, formerly of Lincoln, now visiting here. She spends the winter months in New Jersey, near her two sons, the other one of whom is professor of English at Penn State college.
