## Let's Retain This Tradition!

Nebraska has few traditions, but the one perhaps most outstanding in age of service and eagerness is the one most easily adhered to and obeyed. That is the perennial wearing of freshman caps—those jockey-like little head-

pieces emblazoned with the class year. The mention of the words "freshman caps" seemingly sends shivers up the spines of incoming students. They fear, possibly, to be set aside as a class, or perhaps have had wrongly instilled in them the fear of being freshmen, an avatars descendant from the time when paddles flourished alongside the red caps on the canopus.

There isn't anything degrading or anything to be feared from the practice of wearing the "40." On the contrary, it establishes a signatory, fraternal bond, however fleeting that may be. There are no freshmen class parties or receptions or convocations here. Members of the class of 1940 will have practically no chance to assemble as a group after the initiation ceremony in the coliseum Sept. 24. The red cap worn about on the canopus until the first snow falls signals another neophyte, and to freshmen a fellow classmate.

Therefore, the Nebraskan urges that every freshman on the canopus buy a cap and wear it until the time designated by the Innocent Society when it will be doffed and treasured as a keepsake.

The Nebraskan would like to see a greater bond of good fellowship associated with the wearing of freshman headgear. When one fresh sees another, he should step up to him and introduce himself, claim him as a fellow classmate and part of the university. Class organization has long been a major problem of student government on the canopus. Organization bred into the ranks of freshmen will bear fruit in later years. The red caps can help to do this.

ate in 1898. After 31 years of teaching in Nebraska, he was presented with a life membership in the National Education association at a banquet given in his honor by his fellow members of Phi Beta Kappa, scholastic society. At one time he served as chairman of the N. E. A. life membership association.

In 1896 an honorary degree from Hamilton college was given him in recognition of his work in the schools of New York state.

A well known author, Prof. Brownell contributed several books on science and science teaching and wrote many laboratory manuals in science.

His seven children all are graduates of the university, his three sons being also graduates with advanced degrees from Yale.

Chancellor E. A. Burnett stated concerning the professor's death: "Professor Brownell had a peculiar capacity for friendship. He counted by hundreds former students who attribute much of their professional success to the inspiration of his leadership.
