Musical Footnotes

A recital made up of the music of Gluck, Bach and Chopin was given by Herbert Schmidt, university piano instructor, at the second musical convocation in the Temple Theater yesterday afternoon. Mr. Schmidt's choice of numbers was fortunate. Each seemed to be

well suited to his temperament. The first two arrangements of Gluck's "Melodie" and "Caprice," were especially well executed. In these, there is a delicacy and exactness required which the artist achieved without difficulty. In Bach's Italian Concerto which followed, technical execution was equally efficient. But whatever else Bach's music may be, it is most certainly melodious; and this was conspicuously disregarded in many places by the pianist. The high spot in the program came in the "Largo" of Chopin's B minor Sonata which seemed to enjoy a rather thoro understanding by the artist.
