an ex-senator will be named for the post of chief clerk. R. C. "Dick" Regan, Columbus, next to the oldest member for point of service, will make the nominating speech for Warner. Many job hunters have been circulating among the members in the legislative halls.

The president presides over the unicameral body when the lieutenant governor is not present. Also to be selected is the sergeant at arms, chaplain, first assistant to the chief clerk, and stenographic staff.

The new one house body of senators is expected to be friendly with the governor, and it is expected that the assembly out of courtesy will move the appointment of a committee to notify Governor Cochran that "the legislature" is organized and now ready to receive any communication he may have to make. The committeemen, having conferred with the governor, will announce to the legislators the date and time of the inaugural message.

Following the inauguration of the state's officers, organization of the house, and election of officers and committee on committees, the legislature will probably adjourn Friday until Monday. Bills may be introduced before or after the adjournment and the first bills are those appropriating funds for legislative expenses including salaries of the senators. Salaries of the senators are \$872.00 a year, or \$1,744.18 for the two year term.
