JOHN CURRY SPEAKS AT ART ASSOCIATION SPRING SHOW

Grammatic work has been of Kansas farm scenes and people. Kansas, however, was slow to recognize her talented son. At the time that the university purchased Curry's "Roadmenders" Camp, none of his paintings had as yet been purchased in Kansas.

After varied experiences as an artist in this country and abroad, Curry now has an interesting assignment at the University of Wisconsin. Designated as "artist at large" under the jurisdiction of the college of agriculture, he does little regular teaching. He is allowed the utmost freedom in pursuit of his own artistic interests, and his main work for the university consists in making contacts with the people of the state—farmers, in the main—through expeditions into rural localities. He tries to bring to them a sense of beauty which may be found in their ordinary environment.

In bringing John Stewart Curry to Lincoln March 12, the Nebraska Art Association is carrying out a part of the educational program which has been traditional with the organization since its inception 49 years ago. In recent times Walter Pach, Arnold Bonneck, Allan True, Grant Wood, Walter Gardner, George Buehr, and other artists and critics have been brought here by the association. Last year's guest speaker was George Eddie, prominent American muralist.
