 Reappointed as business manager of the Awgwan is Richard McGinnis, Humboldt senior; his assistant, Leonard Friedel.

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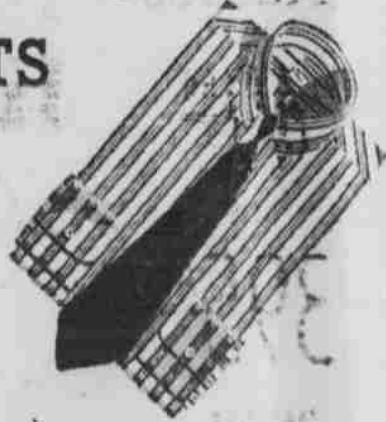
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
