

# Schulte Retires From Helm Of Champion Track Teams

Weir Succeeds to Post of Noted Mentor

Henry F. Schulte, for 19 years Nebraska's head track coach, announced his retirement from the Husker athletic staff during the summer. Retiring at his own request because of ill health, Coach Schulte will be succeeded by Ed Weir, former assistant track coach and freshman football coach. Adolph Lewandowski will assume the duties of head freshman football coach in place of Weir. Harold Petz will serve as assistant coach in both track and football.

Coach Schulte came to Nebraska in 1919 from the University of Missouri. He acted as head football coach in 1919 and 1920 and was head track coach from 1919 to 1938. He has also acted as assistant director of athletics.

During his Husker regime, Schulte has won ten championships in track including five Missouri Valley titles and five Big Six crowns. When he arrived in Lincoln, track was nil as a sport on the campus, but in his second year Nebraska won its first Missouri Valley championship. Others followed in 1922, 1923, 1924 and 1926. Big Six honors were won in 1929, 1932, 1933, 1936 and 1937.

**Aroused Interest.**

In indoor track Schulte's teams piled up an even more impressive tally of victories in 1925, 1926, 1930, 1931, 1932, 1936, 1937 and 1938. At the same time that he was building up the university's track standing, Schulte was arousing new interest and activity in the sport in high schools throughout the state. He inaugurated the pentathlon, the home course relays and numeral roll.

Schulte organized the N club scholarship trophy award and wrote the group's ceremonial. It was he who originated the idea of the electric clock in Memorial stadium and now electric clocks may be found on nearly all of the major grids of the nation. He was instrumental in bringing two national A. A. U. track and field meets to Lincoln, and in 1928 he was given a position on the coaching staff of the United States Olympic squad at Amsterdam where he was in charge of the decathlon men.

Adolph Lewandowski, new freshman football coach, lettered in both football and basketball at Nebraska and after coaching several years at Montana university joined the coaching staff last season.

Major Biff Jones, director of athletics, announced that there will be no additions made to the present coaching staff for the time being.
