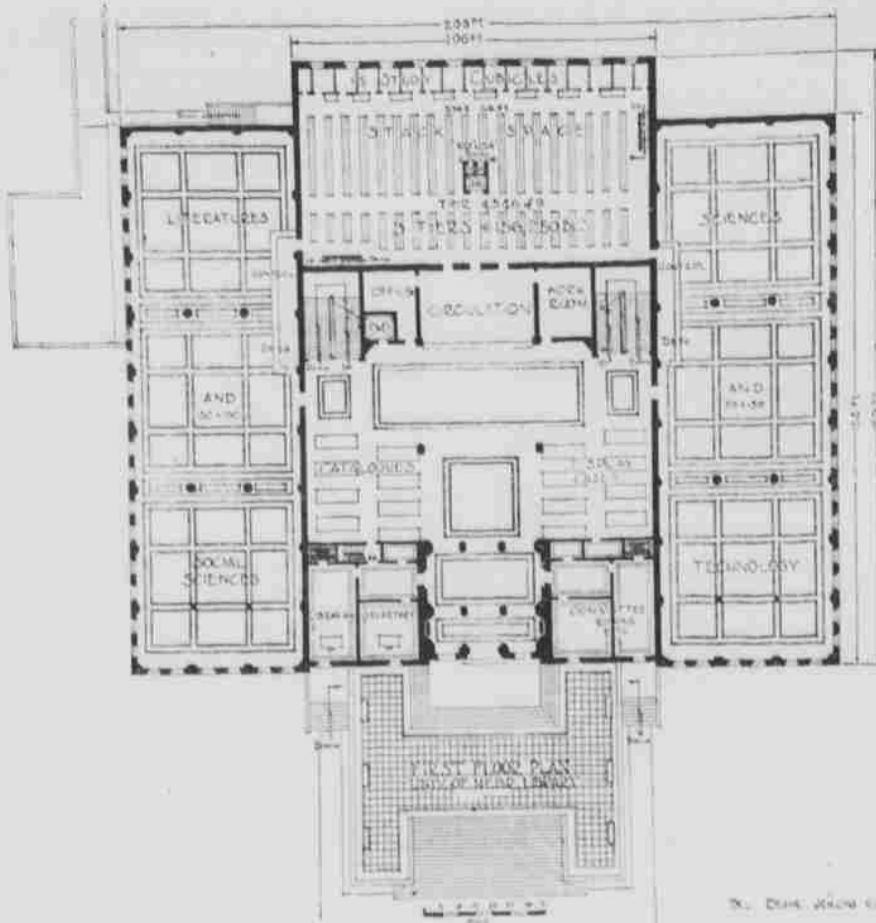


First Floor Plan of Proposed Library

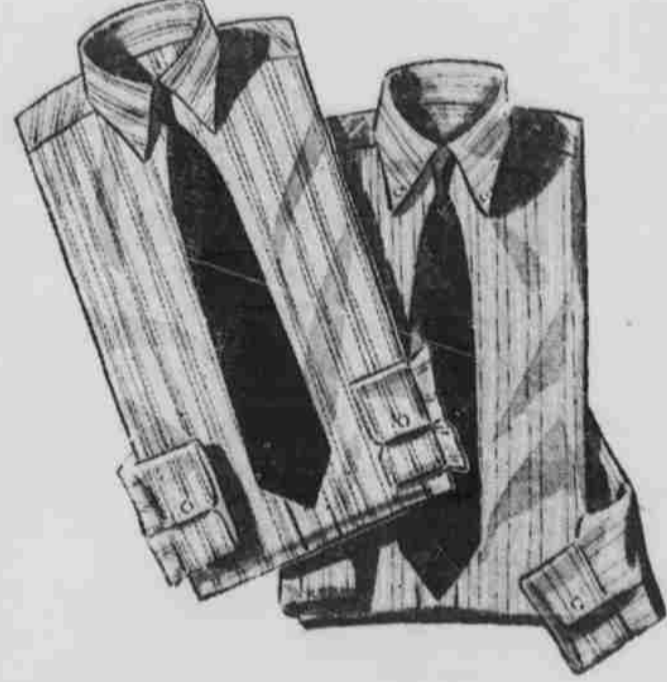
