UN Directory Will Come Out Corn'in Band'

Nineteen hundred forty-oneforty-two student and faculty directory goes on sale Oce. 27, according to the university YMCA, publisher of the directory.

In response to a request to list all non-resident organizations, the editor of the student directory asks the presidents of all organized groups having a bona fide mailing address and telephone number and not already listed in the directory to leave the name of their organization, president's name, address and telephone number at his office in the Y rooms of the Temple.

The information available in the directory includes the name, college and year, home town, Lincoln address, Lincoln telephone number, and fraternal affiliation of every student in resident study on the campus.

Data for the directory is taken from registration cards and is thoroly checked and rechecked to obtain the highest degree of accuracy.

Improvements this year are the omission of unnecessary punctuation from the student lists, new songs and yells, and a list of organizations having more than 25 members that are not mentioned elsewhere in the directory.
