Brother of Husker Charlie... Omahan Sam Vacanti to Start Against Fellow Nebraskans

IOWA CITY, Ia., Sept. 24.—Sophomore Sam Vacanti, former fleet footed Omaha Tech halfback, may start against his home state aggregation, Nebraska's Cornhuskers, when they invade the University of Iowa campus for Saturday's tilt.

Sam has been assigned to the No. 1 eleven this week along with Tom Farmer, Dick Hoerner and Bill Stauss at the other backfield spots, as Coach Eddie Anderson has put his charges up against Nebraska formations displayed by the Hawkeye frosh.

Vacanti was on the heaving end of some long aerals in drills this week, and may get the call for a

starting berth when the Huskers meet the Hawks.

Hoerner had been demoted to the third unit after last week's showing against Washington U. of St. Louis, but was moved again to the first string position.

Nebraska isn't the only gridiron outfit bemoaning the fact that they are without the services of a regular center. Iowa's Bob Lauterbach bruised a knee in practice and Sophomore Tackle Henry Blum has been moved to a pivot position. Forrest Masterson of the second lineup is also on the injury list with a bad rib.
