

Students Attend Church Tonight In Observance Of Annual Event

All Denominations Plan Entertainment

Complete and entertaining plans have been made by churches of every denomination for tonight's observance of all-university church night. Such an occasion as this has been held in the past years in order to acquaint new students with the churches of their preferred denomination and to encourage upperclassmen and old students to attend their services.

As in past years all-university church night will mark the official opening of church activities for the university students. Throughout the year each church will have planned entertainment, young people's groups, and other religious programs for the students who are interested and any of their friends. All university church night and all-university church Sunday, to be observed next Sunday, are planned as an inducement for all students to find their church homes in Lincoln and to attend a church of their denomination throughout their school year.

Lutheran
Lutheran students have the opportunity of observing all-university church night at the First Lutheran church at 17th and A streets at 8 p. m. The evening's program includes games, singing and refreshments, which will be under the auspices of the Luther League and the committee for student work.

Lutheran students of the American Lutheran Conference and of the United Lutheran Church may worship on all-university church Sunday at any of the following churches: First Lutheran, 17th and A Sts.; Grace Lutheran, 14th and F St.; Friends Lutheran, 6th and D St.; The American Lutheran, 24th and U St.; and Our Saviour's Lutheran, 23rd and N St. Recognition will be made that day of all old and new students.

As an added observance of all-university church Sunday members of the Lutheran Student Association will meet at 5:30 p. m. in parlor X in the Union, with many old students present to welcome the new ones. Marvin Johnson, president of the association will be in charge of the meeting. Feature of the program will be an interesting account of Ashram, the national summer camp meeting of Lutheran students, by the association's camp representative, Lorain Will. During the meeting plans for the organization of the Lutheran Student choir will be made. Games and refreshments will conclude the association's meeting.

The Service Club is to be host to all old students and specially invited new students and freshmen at a party to be held at 8 o'clock in Fellowship Hall at First Presbyterian church. Mr. Ray Ramsay will be master of ceremonies in charge of entertainment and recreation.
