

Student Council Judiciary Committee Interprets Rules Governing Elections

Edjotr's Note: These are the rules governing student election proceedings. They were formulated by the judiciary committee of the Student Council and will be rigidly enforced in the coming fall campaign.

The judiciary committee agrees on the following definitions and interpretations of Article IV of the rules of student elections:

Article IV.

No vote shall be solicited at the polls or in the building in which election is being held during election day. No money shall be spent in behalf of any candidate. No printed, mimeographed, typed, or otherwise published material in behalf of any candidate shall be permitted except the impartial announcements of the candidates appearing in the press. Any candidate violating these rules either in person or thru his supporters shall thereby become ineligible.

"No vote shall be solicited" shall mean: No person eligible to vote for any candidate shall be influenced in any way at the polls or in the building in which the election is being held by means or the spoken or written word or any other means, to cast his or her vote for any particular candidate; nor shall any such person be influenced in any means to vote at all.

Place of Election.

"At the polls or within the building in which the election is being held" shall mean: Any place within said building or within one hundred feet from any part of the building. Exception: Any regularly assigned offices on the third floor of the Union for Infraternity and Barb Council. The phrase "at the polls" shall mean: At the place or places, where passing out of ballots to voters, marking of ballots by voters, and placing of ballots in the ballot boxes is taking place.

"During the election day" shall mean: Shall be exchanged at any time from 12 midnight of the day preceding the election to the time that the polls are officially closed.

"No money" shall mean: No cash, checks, mail orders, drafts, stamps, credit or any other article of value.

"Shall be spent" shall mean: Shall be exchanged, traded or given away in any manner.

Backing Candidates.

"In behalf of any candidate" shall mean: No money shall be spent which would in any way influence the results of the election, or in any way influence a voter to cast his vote for any particular candidate or candidates, whose name or names appear on the ballots. The term "candidate" shall include both persons whose names appear on the ballots, and also the political parties with which they may be affiliated. This definition of candidates shall be followed wherever the term appears in this article. A person whose name is to appear on the ballot shall be considered a candidate from the day of his filing for office.

"No printed, mimeographed, typed, or otherwise published material" shall mean: No handbills, posters, papers, newspaper or any other type of materials or advertising on which appears any writings, typing, printing, cartoons, drawings, photographs, or any other type of pictorial representation of thought, which material is to any voter by any means whatever or is posted in any place except the inside of a private home, boarding house, rooming house, fraternity house, or sorority house

should capitalize on the out-of-school exercise of children on the farm, about the home and walking to school."

Serve Community.

Federal and state government must carry much of the administrative burden of supporting education, said Dr. Cyr, though the danger must be avoided is any threat to the right of the community to teach what it believes. He explained that the school's part in this program was to properly serve its community.

"Our small communities have changed from distinctly separate life between town and open country to town-centered communities which include unified activities of town and country," Dr. Cyr said. "The school district is the last barrier to an integrated community life."

except the official posters of the elections committee of the Student Council. Any such material posted in the university residence halls for women except official publicity of the elections committee shall be considered "published material."

Publicity.

"Impartial announcements" shall mean: A list of all candidates for all offices to be filled by the elections, in which list the candidates names must all appear correctly spelled, in the same kind of type, in the same color and shade of ink with no extra markings of any sort beneath, over, or beside any particular names which markings does not appear in the same way by all the names in the list. Such lists may contain the political affiliations of all candidates but no other information about them. Official posters by the elections committee of the Student Council shall be considered impartial announcements.

"The press" shall mean: Any publication which has the approval of the University of Nebraska publication board. In all cases the editors of the publications shall be held directly responsible for what appears in the publication.

Breaking Rules.

"Violating these rules" shall mean: In any way causing the rules of this article to be broken or infringed.

"Either in person or thru his

supporters" shall mean: Either by a personal action or by the action of any one of his supporters or by any member of the political faction with which he is affiliated, no matter whether or not he knows such action will be taken, is being taken, or has been taken.

In considering the definition of the term "candidate" the penalty of violation of a rule shall apply only to the individual with whom the violation is concerned. If the violation is concerned with a political party, then the penalty shall apply to all nominees affiliated with that party.

Ignorance No Excuse.

Ignorance of this article and its interpretations shall not be considered a valid excuse for the violation of the rules of this article either by an individual, a group of individuals, or a political faction.

Regular news items appearing in the press (defined above) and concerning any candidate shall not be considered as violations of this article unless they contain editorial comment about the candidate or unless they are not impartial.
