

Big Six Meet Saturday

Missouri Favored By Fans

... And Statistics

Although there possibly has been less state yard conversation in downtown Lincoln concerning the pending Big Six track and field derby, the village experts seem agreed that Chauncey Simpson's Missouri Tiger men will outscore Nebraska and Oklahoma for the circuit bunting on Memorial stadium cinders Saturday.

Mentor Ed Weir expects every Cornhusker to do his duty tomorrow. Said duty may involve victory over the keenly-balanced Missouri crew, but Mentor Weir's proteges need one more requisite than duty—luck.

Lady Luck Welcome.

If lady luck joins the Husker handwagon, the Weir men might find ways and means of upsetting

the Missourians. Every event-by-event form chart, based on comparative performances, by sports scribes thus far show Mizzou in front of Nebraska by at least ten points.

Al Zikmund and Howie Debus are expected to head the Weir point collectors. Debus is an odd-on favorite to cop discus and javelin laurels and rates an even chance for first in the pole vault.

Zikmund's five-event performance in 100, 220, discus, high jump and broad jump should reap at least ten points.

Nip and Tuck.

"It will be nip and tuck all the day," said Weir early today. "We're going to have to use some high class economy to grab points wherever there's a chance."

Activity will open Saturday morning at 10:00 when preliminaries in both track and field events commence to unroll.

Dope Sheet.

We requested every Big Six track mentor to give us his top performer and top time in each event and thus compiled our comparison summary. On basis of the summary, Missouri will annex the meet Saturday with 53½ points.

Nebraska and Oklahoma are tied for second spot in comparative performances with 42½ tal-

lies each. Kansas State will land fourth berth with 25½ points, followed by Iowa State with 21 and Kansas with 18.

Phi Delta Theta, lacking pitching punch, forfeited to the ATO club.

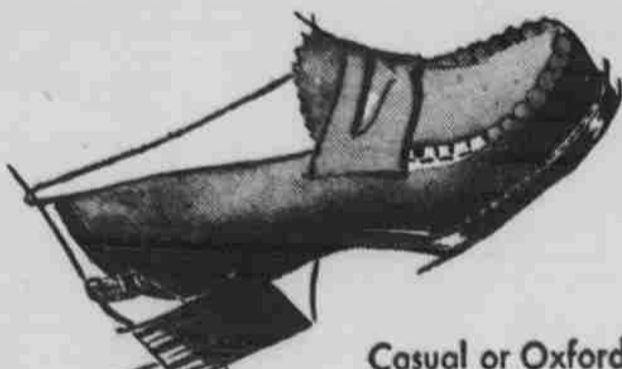
