Army Didn't Clarify AST, Says Princeton President

week, Dr. Harold W. Dodds, president of Princeton university, writing about the recent curtailment of the AST Program, declared that "the army never succeeded in making clear to the trainces how the basic curriculum prepared them specifically to be more valuable soldiers."

"To those familiar with the recent experience of the ASTP and who have watched the political pressures growing up against it, its days have seemed numbered," Dr. Dodds commented. "So far as an outside observer could judge, the army had not succeeded in digesting ASTP or in finding a real place for it in the pattern of this war. Indeed, it didn't seem to be trying very hard to do so, and rumors of serious intradepartmental differences regarding the value of the program were

No OCS for Trainees.

Princeton's head recounted that not long after the basic course opened, the trainees were told that contrary to earlier expectations, very few if any would pass on to officer training. "Despite their disappointment," he said. "Despite "the vast majority appreciated the

Discussing the import of the ASTP on educational theory, Dr Dodds concluded his article by stating

"Had the ASTP continued it might have exerted a postwar impact on higher education of wide social significance. The manner of its ending will neutralize this impact to a considerable extent However, critics who contrast the army training experience with the navy program must not forget that the army was confronted with problems and pressures of quite different magnitudes than the navv.
