## Formals Aren't Formals . . .

Since the fall of 1942 when formal parties were suspended by the university for the duration of the war, students have become increasingly bewildered by conflicting interpretations of the ruling. These interpretations have, for the most part, arisen from : general misunderstanding of the faculty Committee's meaning of the word, "formal," and also from partial ignorance of the rule itself.
To clarify the situation, the faculty Committee on Student Organizations and Social Functions have notified all organized houses by letter, stating the original ruling as follows:
"That is be declared the policy of the University that formal parties shall be suspended for the duration of the war and that the students shall be encouraged to foster originality with economy in their entertainments."
The Committee has further interpreted their stand on the matter of formal parties Uta by adding that girls may dress according to their individual tastes, but that the ban on corsages, printed or engraved invitations, downtown parties, and elaborate decorations is still on in full force.
As interpreted by Dean Verna H. Boyles, Committee secretary, these rules do not pro-
hibit the wearing of evening dress to parties on the campus. As she says, "It isn't the length of the dress that makes a party formal; it's all the things that go with it. This refers specifically to elbow-length kid gloves, engraved invitations, orchid corsages, and the expensive rental of downtown ballrooms, all of which unnecessary expenses should be eliminated because of the war.
Last year, various houses held dances on the campus which girls attended in evening clothes, and much criticism was leveled at these groups. Under the rules, such parties are strictly all right, providing the "things that make a party formal" are cut out.
