Buckley, Strahan and McCulla are receiving top consideration for the end spot. Tackles Kops and Johnson are still battling for a starting berth.

Gophers Will Field Rugged, Heavy Squad

When the University of Nebraska Cornhuskers travel to Minneapolis Sept. 30 to play Minnesota, they will find that Dr. George Hauser will field a heavy team, led by 13 lettermen.

The mighty Swedes can field a team two to three deep in all positions with men with college or prep experience, especially in the line.

The backfield will be headed by Wayne "Red" Williams and Tom Cates, "the mighty mite" of last year. The veteran and elusive Williams, now playing his third year for the Gophers, will be first flight player in the all-important left half position. With speed, passing ability and experience, Williams will be a backfield dependable. Cates, ground gainer in 1943, has been shifted to fullback, where he is making up for his relative lack of weight (170 pounds) by his drive and spirit.

The line will be led by Tackle Bill Aldworth, the outstanding lineman of last year. Big and fast, Aldworth, also a star wrestler, took part in the 1944 all-star game. Another man who would bear watching is Bob Lossie, 100 pound center. Bob, who rapidly developed into an outstanding center toward the end of the 1943 season, has first call on his position and should be a hard man to keep off All-Big Ten lists.

The first team should average close to 190 pounds. On the whole, it should be a typical Gopher team.
