Kansas University shared a 14 to 14 count with Denver last Saturday and are now set to meet civilian Tulsa's Golden Hurricane in a night contest at Tulsa. Iowa State, only team in the Big Six to claim a victory last Saturday, trampled all over Gustavus Adolphus by 49 to 0 and will meet V-12 bolstered Doane college from Crete, Neb., in a Saturday afternoon game at Ames.
