## 'Every Indication' . . .

Results of the recent investigation of the student health service, conducted by a special Student Council committee, will soon be released.

The Council committee is currently surveying and tabulating the opinions of the student body, as recorded in the questionnaires distributed last week through the organized houses. When the tabulation is complete, a comprehensive report will be drafted and submitted to the Council at its Wednesday meeting. What use the Council will make of the report is not definite, but present plans call for giving it full publicity through The Nebraskan and the Lincoln papers and dispatching a copy of it to Chancellor Boucher.

There is every indication that the Council's report will
