dancing to the music of Tommy Kong's orchestra, and wind up Sunday afternoon with a variety show featuring Ginger Rogers and

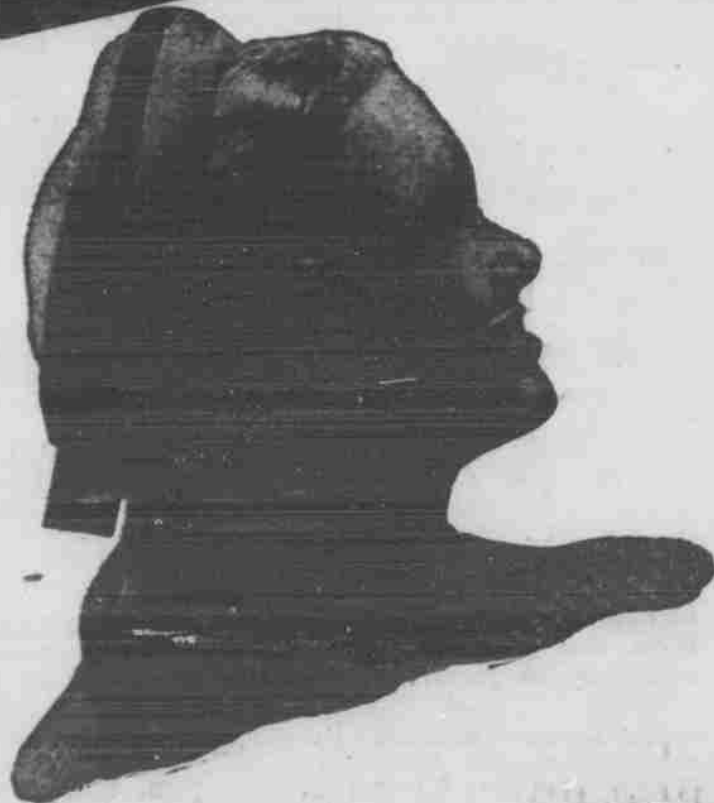
