

# HUSKER HIGHLIGHTS

Big Six teams will travel all over the nation next fall during the football season. With the announcement by Oklahoma that they have signed to meet Army at West Point on Sept. 28, the loop teams have spanned the continent, for Nebraska journeys to the Pacific coast late in November to meet the University of California at Los Angeles.

The Oklahoma schedule, by the way, includes four teams who rated special attention at the close of the 1945 grid year. In addition to Army, the Sooners face the University of Texas, the Southwestern conference champ, and Cotton Bowl ruler; the Oklahoma Aggies, who were Missouri Valley champion and winner of the Sugar Bowl battle on New Year's day; and Missouri, the Big Six winner and Cotton Bowl runnerup.

For those fans who have lost track of the coaching situation in the Big Six football picture, the lineup for next year includes Bernie Masterson at Nebraska; George Sauer at Kansas; Mike Michalske at Iowa State; Hobbs Adams at Kansas State; Don Fautrot at Missouri and Jim Tatum at Oklahoma.

A fifteen man squad has been named by Coach Ed Higginbotham to go against the Hawkeye mermen. There are no lettermen on the Husker roster, but performance turned in by the Nebraska squadmen in time trials have given Higginbotham cause for a bit of optimism.
