Bobby Ginn again sparked the N braska squad by posting a pair of wins. He raced to a 1:57.5 win in the half mile and teamed with Dean Kratz for a dead heat in the mile run in the time of 4:33.7. The mile win was the second lecked arm finish of the season for the two.

A sweep for all three places in the two mile run boosted the Nebraska total, for Don Yocum, Stan Martin and Wayne Roads finished In that order, Yocum was clocked in 10:10.3 for the distance.

In addition to Ginn's sparkling time in the 880, Harvey Stroud flashed top form in the quarter mile and took the event in :50, as well as placing second in the 220 yard dash.
