ern kerosene stoves, when desired. The basic rental as authorized by the Federal Housing Project Administration is \$37.50 with a \$6 increase when furnished. Provisions are made for rental adjustment on basis of ability to pay, the bureau stated.

D. Fourth preferential: Nonresident veterans without children. E. Graduate assistant or structor priority: Persons eligible under 1B will be inserted into the priority list on the basis of a 10 percent quota. That is, one of each ten apartments, as they be-come available, may be assigned to eligible graduate assistants or

instructors. F. All assignments within the groups listed above will be made in order of the date of applica-

G. List organization date. As of September 30, 1946, all applications on file were placed in priority order according to the methods described above, and were assigned a final priority which is to be followed in making assignments. B, Applicants who withdraw their applications and later wish to be reinstated will not be reinstated in their original priority position, but may be permitted to reapply, in which case they will be considered on the same basis

as new applicants.
