

Huskers Beaten In First Round Of Tournament

Losing out to the towering University of Arkansas team, the Huskers were defeated 57 to 46 in the opening game of the all-Big Six conference pre-season basketball tournament played yesterday afternoon in Kansas City.

At the half Arkansas was in the lead 28 to 20. Nebraska reduced the margin to seven points in the middle of the second period but the Arkansas Razorbacks shot ahead to clinch the game.

In the second game of the tournament, the Kansas State Wildcats upset the University of Oklahoma Sooners by a score of 59 to 55.

With six minutes left to play, the Kansas State five brought the score up to a 41 tie, and then took the lead and kept it throughout the remainder of the game.

critic materials needed in Lincoln.

Builders representing all types of material dealers in Lincoln attended a meeting of the Materials Division of the Lincoln Builders bureau, called by the Legion housing committee last week to find the best methods to complete homes which are not being held up because of the lack of certain critical building materials.

Only 50 of the 158 homes now under construction will be ready for occupancy by January, Held said.

Builders could more easily obtain needed supplies, McMahon asserted, if Lincoln dealers would form a materials pool to co-ordinate all building supplies coming into the city, and would make daily reports of materials on hand.

York, Pennsylvania, McMahon pointed out, has completed 400 houses under the plan, while a

nearby city had 500 standing unfinished because of lack of central planning. Lincoln builders explained that they have been co-operating by exchanging construction materials with other dealers and contractors.
