880 Feature.

In the half-mile feature Nebraska's Harold Kopf will face Dick Killough of Missouri. The Bengal strider has a 1:56.9 time to his credit, while Kopf has been clocked in 1:57.5. Killough was out of action at the time of the Big Six indoor meet due to an attack of appendicitis.

Although Kopf finished ahead of Ginn in the 880 yard race when Colorado's Dave Bolen won the event, the tiny Madison runner should not be counted out of the half-mile picture.

Team balance is expected to bring the Tigers a victory over Nebraska. The Huskers are bereft of strength in the discus and shot with Dick Piderit sidelined by inelgibility, although Charlie Toogood is now finished with his gridiron chores and might bolster the NU weight department.

Herb Grote looks like a good bet to capture the javelin crown, but Nebraska pole vaulters Dick Miller and Don Cooper will have to be at their best to beat off the challenge of Bill Blackwell and Justin Knapp of the Missouri team.
