

ACP Rates Daily High In Analysis

An honor rating of first class has been awarded the Daily Nebraskan by the Associated Collegiate Press, newspaper judging organization, which analyzes and rates the publications of the schools of America.

The evaluation was divided into four sections: news value and sources; news writing and editing; headlines, typography and makeup; and department pages and special features. Honor ratings this year ranged from All-American to fourth class; no Peacemakers were awarded.

In appraising the news value of the Daily Nebraskan, the judges said, "Nebraskan reporters seem to be doing an excellent job of covering the campus news."

The ACP stresses that the purpose in scoring newspapers "is the effectiveness with which they serve their individual schools. It is not to create inter-school rivalry, but to provide an agency by which staffs may be aided in giving their schools and communities a significant publication, and to help the staffs in the solution of their problems."
